SYNOPSIS

The suspect was struck in the torso one time and was transported to an area hospital.

SUMMARY:

On January 4, 2023 at approximately 1618 hours, Officer Hooper was dispatched to 418 French Avenue after V1 called GVPD to report a theft of parts from his truck by his former landlord, Austin Wallace. Officer Hooper arrived on scene at 1628 hours and made contact with V1. While conducting his investigation, Officer Hooper and V1 observed Wallace leave the detached garage (accessed off of Jenkins Street) on foot and walk towards the main residence. Officer Hooper walked to his patrol vehicle with the intent of driving around the block to make contact with Wallace on the French Avenue side of the residence. As Officer Hooper was approaching his patrol vehicle, he heard two gunshots coming from the area of 418 French Avenue. Officer Hooper advised NCRDC of shots fired at approximately 1645 hours.

Officer Hooper responded to the front of the residence where he located V1 standing in the roadway in front of 418 French Avenue. V1 advised Officer Hooper that Wallace had shot him with what he first believed to be a rubber bullet. Officer Perry, Corporal Newman, V2, V3, V4, and V5 responded to the area after hearing the report of shots fired.

NOTE: A slug consistent with a .22 caliber firearm was recovered from V1's abdomen later in the day at Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital.

Corporal Newman responded to V1's location and began evaluating him medically while holding his perimeter position to the north of 418 French Avenue.

While V5 was holding a perimeter position near the intersection of French Avenue and Jenkins Street, Wallace emerged from the front yard of 410 French Avenue and fired one round at V5. Officer Perry witnessed this incident upon her arrival on scene. It should be noted that V5 was in full CHP uniform and was driving a fully marked CHP patrol Tahoe with the overhead emergency lights and the MVARs (dash camera) activated.

After hearing the additional shot fired, Officer Hooper, V2, V3, and V4 made their way to the fence-line in between 410 French Avenue and 550 Jenkins Street. As they approached the front yard of 410 French Avenue, Wallace fled west from the residence, crossing French Avenue and running through the driveway and around the back of 417 French Avenue. Officer Hooper, V2, V3, and V4 chased after Wallace. As V2, V3 and V4 approached the southwest corner of 417 French Avenue, Wallace fired an additional shot towards them from his position from the field behind the residence.

V2 fired one round from their department issued patrol rifle and V3 fired two rounds from their department issued pistol at Wallace, striking him once in the torso. Wallace surrendered at that time and was detained in handcuffs. A firearm was located in close proximity to Wallace and was secured by officers on scene. An ambulance was requested to the scene while officers performed first aid on Wallace.

Wallace was transported to Sutter Roseville Medical Center where he has received continuing treatment of a single gunshot wound to the torso.

V1 was transported to Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital where he has been recovering from a single gunshot wound to the abdomen.

It should be noted that Officer Hooper, Corporal Newman and V2 were in full GVPD patrol uniform during this incident. Due to their special duty assignments, Officer Perry, V3, and V4 were wearing approved special duty uniforms along with external vest carriers, clearly marked with large font "POLICE" patches on the front and rear of their carriers.

During the investigation immediately following the incident, it was confirmed that Wallace had been in possession of a .22 caliber revolver with 4 expended casings inside of the cylinder and 2 unexpended cartridges. A search warrant served at Wallace's residence located additional similar ammunition and firearm accessories.

Wallace is under continuing observation by GVPD personnel and will be placed under arrest upon his discharge from Sutter Roseville Medical Center.

SUMMARY:

On the above listed date and time, I executed Nevada County Search Warrant #WA0000220 at 418 French Avenue along with Detective Grube, GVPD Evidence Technician Tina West, NCSO Detective Sonnier and NCDA Investigator Salinas. During the search of the property, and additional search warrant was obtained to further clarify some of the items to be seized. Both search warrants were written by NCSO Detective Strachan. Warrant #WA0000219 was approved by Nevada County Superior Court Judge Sloven. Warrant #WA0000220 was approved by Nevada County Superior Court Judge Thomsen. It should be noted that both warrants included several locations that were searched consecutively and concurrently by members of NCSO, NCDA, TPD and GVPD. During the search warrant, NCSO Lieutenant Perry, NCSO Sergeant Greene, and NCDA Investigator Tassone assisted at various times.

While conducting a search of the garage at 418 French Avenue, an expended .22 caliber shell casing (E6), a box of .22 caliber ammunition (E15B), and two unexpended .22 caliber rounds (E15C) were located. NCSO Detective Sonnier advised me that the three items appeared to be consistent with the unexpended rounds and shell casings recovered from Wallace's firearm the previous evening (NCSO Case #12300034).

During the execution of the search warrant, I observed that the main residence at 418 French Avenue appeared to be unoccupied and contained miscellaneous furniture and mattresses that appear to have been in the process of being moved.

Several items of property were recovered during the execution of the search warrants. See property list below for items collected by GVPD. All items were returned to GVPD and booked into the property unit. A copy of the property taken from 418 French Avenue was left inside of the residence prior to it being re-secured.

Photographs were taken throughout the warrant service by GVPD Evidence Technician West. They will be uploaded to this report in an additional supplement.

AREAS TO BE SEARCHED:

NARRATIVE

On 01/04/23 at approximately 1700 hours, I was informed of a critical incident that occurred on French Street near Jenkins Street in Grass Valley.

I responded to the location and was advised that there were potential residences that had witnesses to the event.

I interviewed (WI) [REDACTED] who resided at [REDACTED] French Street regarding the incident. Nevada County District Attorney Investigator Esteban Salinas was assisting with the interview. We spoke with [REDACTED] at approximately 14:47 hours in the living room of her residence. [REDACTED] agreed to have the interview recorded and provided the following statement in summary.

[REDACTED] said that she owns the property and lives in the main house but has a tenant that lives in a back unit. She advised that she was in the back of the house laying in her bedroom and she heard a bang but she kind of ignored it. [REDACTED] then received a phone call from her tenant who works at [REDACTED] which is at the end of French Street and Mill Street. [REDACTED] said that her tenant called her and asked if she could see what was going on because there were a lot of police officers in the area. [REDACTED] then was on the phone and began walking around the inside of her house and looking out the windows to see if she could see anything. She said that she saw police vehicles to the left of her house by the mailboxes. [REDACTED] said she then saw a persons head walking from the right to the left in her front yard. [REDACTED] said she didn't know if it was a police officer or someone else. She said that the subject then walked back to the front entrance of her residence and then walked up the stairs and opened the front porch gate of her screened in porch. [REDACTED] said that the subject then was tapping on the front glass door of her residence with a silver handgun. [REDACTED] said that she was still on the phone with her tenant and told him about the incident but then she went to hide. She did not think that the subject saw her when he was on the porch because most of the lights were off inside her house. [REDACTED] said that she told her tenant to call 911 at that time. [REDACTED] said that when the subject was on her front porch, she could tell that he was not a police officer and was not in uniform. She advised that he looked startled and nervous.

[REDACTED] described the subject as a white male adult in his twenties or thirties with sandy blonde shorter hair. She thought he was wearing a sweatshirt, jeans. She said he quickly left the area. [REDACTED] said that then called 911 to report the incident.

[REDACTED] believed that she heard 3 gunshots after that incident.

[REDACTED] said that the first bang she heard she thought was the weather or a branch falling or something.

We advised [REDACTED] that her basement door appeared to be forced in. This is a side door on her residence that we observed when we were walking up to the residence. The door frame had been forced in and broken. The screws holding the door locking mechanism were ripped out of the wall. (See photos in Evidence.com). There also appeared to be a wet and muddy shoe impression on the door to the basement. We showed [REDACTED] the door and she advised that her door was not damaged prior to that incident and the frame and door locking mechanism were intact when she last saw it. We also showed her an open side gate of her residence. She said that she always closes the side gate due to her dogs.

It should be noted that this basement part of the house is not directly connected to the living quarters but is a storage area / laundry area.

The conversation with [REDACTED] was recorded via AXON body worn camera and uploaded to Evidence.com.

SUMMARY:

On 01/04/2023 at 1645 hours, I responded to French Street for a " Shots Fired" radio transmission by Officer Hooper. I immediately responded code 3. While I was en route, I heard Officer Hooper describe the victim and suspect, as well as request medical aid respond. Officer Hooper said the suspect was wearing a black sweatshirt and the victim a yellow reflective vest.

On this date, I was driving a GVPD fully marked patrol vehicle. I was wearing my special assignment uniform, black polo with my name and badge embroidered, gray tactical pants and black boots. due to the weather, I was wearing my GVPD issued dark blue patrol jacket that had GVPD patched on the arms, my name and badge with are embroidered in the front of the jacket. Over my jacket, I had placed my black outer tactical bullet proof vest on. My vest says "Police" in 3 inch letters on the front and back of the vest. My Axon Body Camera was attached to the front of my vest and was recording at the time. I was also wearing my special assignment duty gun and radio.

Upon my arrival, I located Officer Hooper in the driveway of 546 Jenkins Avenue, which was a few houses north from French Street. He was alone standing down the driveway of that address. At this time, GVPD Detectives [REDACTED] and Chris Roberds arrived on scene. I continued down the driveway and contacted Officer Hooper who advised he thought the suspect was inside the property' s garage. I later learned the address to the garage was 418 French Street. 418 French Street property backs up to 546 Jenkins Street.

At this time, a couple of NCSO Deputies arrived to assist. Officer Hooper then instructed all of us to surround the garage. As we were positioning around the garage, I heard a single gunshot coming from an area just south of my location, which was towards French Street. Officer Hooper advised dispatch of shots fired.

I began running down the driveway of 546 Jenkins Street towards the street, with several other officers and deputies.

At this time, Officer Hooper was behind me and told me to stay behind at this location in case the suspect circled back. I then went back up the driveway and stood behind the fence running along the south side of the driveway. NCSO Deputy Cody Johnson remained there with me. While I had been running back down the driveway, I advised dispatch of the area I believed the single shot came from.

Just as soon as I positioned myself behind the fence, I noticed a WMA wearing a black sweatshirt come out from some bushes in the yard of 418 French Street. I immediately radioed this out to the other on scene officers. Seconds later, I heard shouting coming from the French Street area. It sounded as if the officers were shouting at the suspect. After about 15 seconds, I heard a gun shot of low caliber, followed by three other higher caliber gun shots.

Next, I ran south past the fence and into the yard of 418 French Street. While in the backyard, I approached the house. Upon approaching the house, I ran to the west side of the home to get on to French Street. When I came upon the home, I ran down the west side of the house and came upon a 6-foot locked gate. I then turned and ran back around the east side of the house and was able to get into the front yard of 418 French Street. Due to the loud sounds of the emergency sirens, I had difficulty hearing my radio. Next, I jumped over the 4-foot front yard fence and ran onto French Street. After jumping the fence, I ran west on French Street and subsequently located the other responding officers. The officers were standing in what appeared to be a vacant lot behind 421 French Street.

When I noticed the officers in the field, it appeared to me as if they were searching for the suspect, but a minute or two later, I realized they had apprehended the suspect.

When I was running to the other officer's location, I noticed Officer Kyle Newman and his patrol car on French Street several yards in front of me. I noticed Officer Newman was assisting someone out of the back seat of his patrol car. I later learned this person was the victim. As I was running towards the field and other officers, Officer Newman called me over to his location, which was in front of 438 French Street. When I contacted Officer Newman, he advised me he was with the wounded victim and the suspect was down in the field. He told me the suspect had sustained an abdominal wound and asked me to take his first aid kit to the treating officer. He added there were chest seals in his kit for the suspect's stomach wounds.

I then proceeded to grab Officer Newman's first aid kit and ran it down to the field where the suspect was located. Upon my approach to the scene, I noticed Officer Hooper and Detective Roberds rendering medical aid to the suspect. I then handed the first aid kit to CHP Officer Peter Nesinov and mentioned there were chest seals inside the first aid kit. CHP Officer Nesinov opened the first aid kit and pulled out the chest seals and handed the kit back to me. Moments later, I noticed the officers rendering aid apply a chest seal to the suspect's wound. While the officers were rendering aid to the suspect, I noticed GVPD Officer Brown standing nearby. I asked Officer Brown who shot the suspect at which time he advised me he had. I then advised Officer Brown to come with me. When I advised Officer Brown to come with me, I noticed he was holding a revolver. The revolver would ultimately be the suspect's weapon.

Before leaving the area, I asked Officer Brown to provide me with a public safety statement. Officer Brown then advised me of the direction of his and the suspect's gunfire. The directions of the gun fire exchange were in a N/E and S/W direction and there were no other outstanding suspects. I looked in those directions and noticed homes to the northeast and an open field to the southwest. Later, NCSO deputies checked the homes to the northeast.

I proceeded to escort Officer Brown away from the scene, and Detective ██████ followed. We returned to our patrol vehicles, which were parked in front of 546 Jenkins Avenue.

Moments later, I spoke with Sgt. CHP Officer Peter Nesinov, who advised me the suspect shot at CHP Officer ██████'s patrol car upon his arrival.

On the date of this incident, I was the GVPD Police Officer Association President. When I was with Officer Brown after the incident, I providing him with his legal representation. After the scene's were secured, I drove Officer Brown back to the Grass Valley Police Department and stood by with him until he was processed by the Nevada County DA Investigation team. During my time with Officer Brown we did not discuss the details of this case. After Officer Brown was processed, Officer Russell Johnson drove him home.

I recorded the incident with my Axon BWC and uploaded it to Evidence.com.

NARRATIVE

On 01/04/2023 at approximately 1645 hours, I was sitting in my office at Grass Valley Police Department. I am currently assigned as a School Resource Officer for the Grass Valley School District and had just returned from the school. I heard the radio traffic over the department speaker "shots fired". I responded to the area of French Ave. and Jenkins Street as that was the area mentioned on the radio as to where the incident was occurring. I drove to the area of the incident code three, with lights and sirens activated in my unmarked silver Chevy Tahoe.

I responded to the area via Mill Street from downtown Grass Valley. As I turned west onto French Ave. from Mill Street, I was directly behind a CHP vehicle who was going the same direction. As I drove up French Street from Mill Street, I began to look for any emergency vehicles and did not see any. As I approached Jenkins Street (on the northeast side of French Ave.) I saw a Grass Valley Police marked unit at the top of the hill on Jenkins Street with several armed officers together near the vehicle.

Due to the fact that I am not a uniformed officer and was wearing a fleece sweatshirt and tactical pants (my daily uniform), I parked at the bottom of Jenkins Street on the north side of the road at the entrance of a gravel driveway. I was a great distance from the other officers, so that I could retrieve my Kevlar vest from the rear area of my vehicle and put it on prior to joining the other officers. As I was standing at the rear of my vehicle, CHP Officer [REDACTED] approached me. He had parked on French Ave. just past the intersection of Jenkins St on the northeast side of the road. He walked up to my location and we spoke for a brief moment about the status of the incident.

CHP Officer [REDACTED] began to walk back towards his vehicle and as I was still standing at the rear of my vehicle putting on my vest, I looked to my left and I saw a white male adult wearing black clothing standing on the other side of the fence on the far side of the gravel driveway with his arm extended. He was holding a firearm and then I saw him shoot one round in the direction of French Ave. towards the CHP vehicle. It should be noted that I could see the CHP Officer when the suspect fired. I could see the male from the waist up. As he shot I took cover behind my vehicle as I was still in the middle of putting on my vest. I yelled "Gun!" Several times towards CHP Officer [REDACTED] and then yelled up the street to the other officers that the suspect was in the yard with the fence. I continued to get my vest on, however my body worn camera was sitting in the trunk area of my vehicle as I had placed it there while I got dressed before intending to place it on my vest. I do not wear a body worn camera in my current position daily and do not wear a full uniform. In the chaos of the event unfolding as they did, I did not have an opportunity to place my camera on my vest.

I saw several officers run down the street, Detective [REDACTED] took cover near the front of my vehicle briefly as we looked for the suspect as he was no longer visible in the fenced yard. I did not see which direction he had gone after he fired the firearm as I had taken cover.

Shortly after, officers began running down Jenkins Street towards French Ave. as someone had visibility of the suspect, I could hear them yelling. I could not hear what they were saying. I began running in the direction of the other officers

when Officer Hooper ran by and told me to get my vehicle. I ran back towards my vehicle briefly and then made the decision to turn around and proceed on foot as CHP Officer [REDACTED] had gotten in his vehicle to drive forward, thinking that if the suspect continued on a path that cut through to another roadway, CHP was mobile. As I was running north on French Ave. I heard gun shots. I can not recall how many I heard.

I continued up the street to a house on the west side of the street with a detached garage. I recall running through the yard between the house and garage and then I could see the officers in the field behind the house with the suspect. I heard them say on the radio that he was detained. Before crossing the creek behind the house, I turned around as several Nevada County Deputies had announced their arrival on the radio and I wanted to ensure they could see where we were. I continued towards the officers who had the suspect detained. Once I was there with them, they had the suspect detained in handcuffs on his stomach and the firearm was secured under an officers foot, away from the suspect. I recall the firearm being a black revolver with a wooden handle. The officers were performing medical aid, although, due to the chaos, I can not recall who or what they were specifically doing. There were several of officers, and one officer yelled for someone retrieve the medical bag. Due to the fact that there were already so many officers tending to the suspect, I continued toward Officer Newman, who was standing on the east sidewalk of French Ave. across from Carnegie Way. I stood with him and the victim as I guided medics and fire personnel to the location of the officers with the suspect.

A short time later, Officer Hooper requested that I ride in the ambulance with the suspect who was being combative. Officer Rodriguez and I went with the suspect, who was identified in the ambulance as Austin Wallace by his CDL. While in transit, Mr. Wallace asked me and Officer Rodriguez several times to kill him, and to put a bullet in his head. He also told the medics to " let him die" , however the medics told him they were not going to do that. During the transport, Paramedic [REDACTED] used scissors to cut off Mr. Wallace' s black shirt. He was wearing black underwear and one shoe upon arrival at the hospital. The shirt was in multiple pieces and [REDACTED] stated that she placed the pieces on the gurney.

Upon arrival at Sutter Roseville Medical Center, Mr. Wallace began to kick and flail his legs as he was being transported into the trauma room. We held on to his legs to prevent him from kicking or attempting to get off the gurney, no additional force was needed. Once in the trauma room, his handcuffs were removed by me, and the doctors sedated him. They began to assess and treat Mr. Wallace, and there were approximately fifteen to twenty medical personnel in the room surrounding his bed performing multiple tasks. Officer Rodriguez and I stood near the door as there was no where else to stand. He was transported to the operating room, and we began to ask where his clothing was. We located part of his shirt, his underwear and one shoe in the trauma room. The remaining cut pieces of his clothing could not be located, and it is unclear who picked them up and disposed of them during the time in the trauma room. The clothing items and shoe were placed in paper bags.

Upon the completion of the surgery, the surgical nurse came out to tell us that the surgery went well and provided me the bullet they recovered from inside Mr. Wallace' s body. I obtained a copy of the chain of custody form for the bullet signed by the nurse and myself. Officer Pengelley arrived to relieve us, and he stayed with Mr. Wallace. Officer Covella was present outside and transported Officer Rodriguez and me back to Grass Valley Police Department. Upon arrival at Grass Valley Police Department, I handed over the clothing, shoe, bullet and chain of custody form to District Attorney Investigator Brandon Corchero who sealed the items and took them into his custody. Refer to the chain of custody form for the Sutter Roseville nurse' s information.

At no time did I, nor Officer Rodriguez ask any question of Wallace.

SUMMARY:

On the above listed date and time, [REDACTED] responded to the 500 block of Jenkins Street to pick up Wallace's dog that was left in his garage unattended. I had earlier cleared the garage of occupants and observed the presence of the dog inside of the garage. I did not observe and food or water in plain view, however I was just conducting a protective sweep at the time and did not inspect anything closely.

I escorted [REDACTED] to the residence and opened the front door to the garage. [REDACTED] then

called the dog out to us from the front porch of the garage. The front door was then re-secured and I escorted [REDACTED] back out of the perimeter.

While with [REDACTED], I spoke with her regarding any recent interactions she had with Wallace. In summary, [REDACTED] stated that Wallace had made recent comments regarding being depressed about having a house, but not his family. [REDACTED] stated that she renewed her restraining order after Wallace began to "overstep boundaries" back in August. [REDACTED] advised me that Wallace had shown up at her residence approximately two days prior because she does not usually answer his calls and he wanted to see [REDACTED] (Wallace's children). [REDACTED] stated that within the past week or two, Wallace had messaged her from a "random" facebook account that he had made. [REDACTED] told me that she did not understand the context of the message, but he had sent her a picture of a Solano County CHP "thing" that she thought was related to the fact that they used to go to the ocean there. I asked [REDACTED] if she knew Wallace to have any weapons. She advised me that he had been arrested in the past with "a bunch of (inaudible)" and during an incident in Placer County in 2019 where Wallace had walked out the door with a weapon, but she believes that his grandmother had taken it from him.

At that time, I concluded my conversation with [REDACTED] and she left the area in a vehicle.

SUMMARY :

Grube on my department-issued cell phone requesting my assistance on a critical incident that occurred on French Avenue near Jenkins Street in Grass Valley. I reported to the department to collect my field bag and department-issued Nikon D3100 camera. I then reported to the scene at the road closure of Jenkins Street and Brighton at approximately 2100 hours to assist with photographing and evidence collection. Once the scene was secured by officers, Det. Grube picked me up from the corner of Jenkins Street and Brighton Street and briefed me on the case.

Using my department-issued Nikon D3100 camera, I photographed scene overall photographs from multiple distances. Each evidence marker was photographed with each evidence item. Due to extreme weather conditions, and darkness, the battery was low and I was unable to capture the final few photographs on the Nikon D3100 camera. At that time, I used my department-issued cell phone and recorded a series of 12 photographs during the collection of evidence items E1 and E2.

On 01/04/2023 at approximately 2350 hours, Det. Grube and I arrived at Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital, 155 Glasson Way, Grass Valley CA to retrieve evidence.

We contacted Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital Nursing Supervisor [REDACTED] in the emergency

room. She provided us with a plastic baggie that contained a piece of paper that had the lead projectile that was removed from [REDACTED] during his emergency surgery.

Upon our return to Grass Valley Police Department, Det. Grube packaged the collected evidence in its original packaging and hand-delivered it to me to secure in the Evidence room while we completed the booking process. The evidence item collected from Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital was submitted and booked as item E31.

On 01/05/2023 at approximately 1112 hours, I returned to 418 French Avenue along with Det. Grube, Sgt. Butler, NCSO Detective Sonnier, and NCDA Investigator Salinas. At that time, Det. Grube and Sgt. Butler briefed me on the areas included in the search warrant and what investigation photographs were needed. Using my department-issued Nikon D3100 camera, I photographed scene overall photographs from multiple distances. Each evidence marker was photographed with each evidence item. Due to extreme weather conditions, the battery was having difficulty focusing while utilizing the flash. Notification:

On 01/04/23, at approximately 1645 hours, while Ofc Hooper was attending a possible theft call at 418 French Ave, I heard him on the radio state that shots had been fired. From my location near E Main St and Presley Wy, I activated my emergency lights and siren and responded to his location. While enroute, I activated my AXON Body Worn Camera. See AXON BWC Footage for further details.

While responding to Ofc Hooper' s location, I heard him make several updates, including that the suspect was Austin Wallace, and that the victim was wearing a yellow jacket. At approximately 1649 hours, I arrived in the area and found the victim, [REDACTED] on the sidewalk in front of 435 French Ave. I exited my patrol vehicle and approached [REDACTED] and asked him what had happened and if he was alright. [REDACTED] told me the following in summary:

█████ stated that he believed he had been shot by a rubber bullet in the stomach by Wallace over a property dispute. See Ofc Hooper' s original report for further details regarding the property in question. █████ then showed me where he had been struck by lifting up his shirt. Approximately 1/2 inch left of and 1-1/2 inches above his navel, I observed a circular wound approximately 1/2 inches in diameter. The wound was not actively bleeding at the time, but the injury appeared fresh as the blood was still bright red. While showing me his injury, █████ continued to display his discomfort and pain. █████ made numerous statements that he could not find a position in which he was not in pain, whether it was standing, leaning, or sitting.

While speaking with █████ I heard a gunshot go off near my location. For █████ safety, I placed him in front of my patrol vehicle to ensure that he had some sort of cover. After a moment, I decided it would be better to have █████ take a seat in my patrol vehicle to ensure he remained in a safe location.

I then observed other GVPD officers begin to cross French Ave closer to Jenkins St. I ran from my location towards them, and heard additional gunshots being fired. As I rounded the corner, I advised dispatch that we were at 417 French Ave in the backyard. I observed two elderly subjects near the rear of the residence, and I ordered them to go back inside for their safety. From my vantage point, I observed a subject, later identified as Wallace, lying down in the field with the other officers aiming their weapons at Wallace. I advised dispatch that Wallace was surrendering.

One of the officers on scene advised that Wallace was safely detained, and I requested medical units respond to French Ave at its intersection with Carnegie Ln code 3, and that I would wave them down. I then ran to that location and fire and medical personnel were directed towards Wallace. I then went back to █████ and requested a second medical unit code 2 to my location. █████ was transported to Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital a short time later.

At approximately 1748 hours, I arrived at Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital and responded to bed 20 where █████ was placed. █████ was returning from a CT scan, and a short time later it was determined that █████ had in fact been shot with a projectile that had penetrated his abdomen, rather than a rubber bullet as he had believed. The medical personnel advised that █████ had been given a dose of fentanyl for pain.

I asked █████ if he would be willing to disclose his medical records, and he verbally consented. Additionally, I asked █████ who had shot him, and again he stated that it had been Austin Wallace. I then asked █████ to describe what he believed Wallace had shot him with. █████ stated that he believed it had been a dark colored revolver with a six-inch barrel.

Nevada County Sheriff' s Office Detective Strachan then arrived a short time later and conducted a more formal interview with █████

On 01/06/23 at approximately 1230 hours, Sgt. Butler and I spoke with [REDACTED] who was in the medical surgery recovery area at Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital. [REDACTED] appeared to be alert and responsive. He was answering questions clearly, his eyes were open, he was able to move his arms around and sit up and he appeared alert and oriented.

We asked [REDACTED] about the incident that occurred on 01/04/23. [REDACTED] provided the following statement in summary. He used to live at 418 French Avenue. He used to rent the house from Austin Wallace who was his childhood friend. They rented the house from approximately October 2021 until July 2022. [REDACTED] moved out of the residence and began moving his property to another location. He came back to pick up his truck that was left on the property and discovered his wheels and tires, interior parts and engine parts were removed from the vehicle. He believed that Austin had stolen parts from the vehicle. He attempted to contact Austin who was in the detached garage at the time but did not get a response.

[REDACTED] then contacted Grass Valley Police Department to request an officer come out and contact Austin regarding the missing car parts. Officer Hooper arrived on scene and attempted to contact Austin in the garage but was unsuccessful.

Officer Hooper took police report # G2300033 regarding the missing auto parts.

As Officer Hooper was walking away, Austin ran out of the garage and down towards French Avenue. [REDACTED] began trying to record Austin with his cell phone and began following Austin to try and speak with him. Austin climbed over a fence into the front yard of 418 French Avenue and [REDACTED] followed him and climbed over the fence. [REDACTED] advised that he believed his cell phone was still recording and he put the cell phone in his pocket as he hopped the fence behind Austin.

[REDACTED] landed on the ground in the front yard and stood up. As he stood up, he was hit in the stomach by a projectile. Austin was standing near the front porch area of the property and said something along the lines, " It wasn' t that serious" . [REDACTED] said that Austin then raised a handgun towards him again. As he did, [REDACTED] dove onto the ground and was shot at again. This second shot hit the fence behind him. [REDACTED] then climbed/jumped over the fence and behind a retaining wall on French street. At that time, Officer Hooper arrived to his location.

[REDACTED] initially believed that he was shot with a rubber bullet due to the lack of blood, however he did recall that it knocked the wind out of him.

[REDACTED] said that Austin then climbed over the railing on the porch away from his location and out of sight.

We showed [REDACTED] an areal map of the house and area. We had him draw and X where he was located an a dot where Austin was located when he shot him. (This was booked into GVDP Evidence as E207 A).

[REDACTED] was provided with Victim Confidentiality paperwork, Marcy' s Law paperwork, and Cal VIP information.

[REDACTED] provided us with the password to his cell phone.

[REDACTED] filled out and completed a medical release form regarding his medical records.

[REDACTED] believed that Austin regularly uses methamphetamine, fentanyl and heroin.

[REDACTED] advised that Austin owes them money for the deposit on the house after they moved out. He had tried to contact him regarding this money but had not received anything from him. [REDACTED] denied ever threatening him or trying to hurt Austin. [REDACTED] advised that he was following Austin the day of the shooting to talk with him and a welfare check on him. He never said anything to Austin prior to being shot by him.

NARRATIVE

On January 4, 2023, at approximately 1646 hours, I was in the Sally port of Wayne Brown Correctional Facility when I heard Officer Hooper advised "shots fired" in the area of Jenkins St. After completing the jail booking of [REDACTED] (refer to case#G2300032) at approximately 1650 hours, I activated my lights and sirens of my marked patrol vehicle and advised Nevada County Regional Dispatch Center that I was in route to Officer Hooper's call for service.

I arrived on scene at approximately 1659 hours. When I arrived on scene, I attempted to locate officers at the scene. I first saw Detective Perry who informed me that the suspect had shot at her and the CHP officer. I then was able to locate Officer Brown and Detective [REDACTED]. Officer Brown was holding a black revolver with a wooden handle. Officer Brown stated it was the suspect's firearm and Officer Brown was attempting to secure it. While they secured the firearm, Detective [REDACTED] requested I look for other possible victims in the area. During that time, I was soon diverted towards the ambulance. Ambulance staff were requesting a second officer to assist in transporting the suspect to Sutter Roseville Medical Center. At approximately 1708 hours, Detective Perry and I rode in the ambulance to the hospital.

During that time, I learned the suspect's name was Austin Wallace. Wallace continually asked me to shoot him in the head. At one point Wallace stated "Rodriguez, do me a favor put a bullet in my head, please." After I told him I would not do that he asked "please." In one instance, medic [REDACTED] began to check a vein and Wallace said "no, mother fucker, let me die." As the medics attempted to stabilize and provide medical intervention, Wallace continued to squirm and continually asked to not be treated. Refer to body worn camera footage for details.

When we arrived at the hospital, Wallace became combative and attempted to escape from the gurney. He kicked the counter and attempted to flee in efforts to avoid medical treatment. Wallace had to be physically restrained by hospital staff and law enforcement to receive medical treatment. I held Wallace's feet and assisted the nurses with the application of restraints. Wallace was wheeled away into OR room 01 for surgery.

Detective Perry and I collected Wallace's underwear, some of his ripped sweatshirt, identification card, and one shoe. All the items were stored in separate paper bags per clothing item. The bullet found in Wallace's body was recovered by surgeons and provided to Detective Perry for evidence collection. The items were booked for evidence by Detective Sara Perry. It is important to note, some of Wallace's clothing was disposed while we tended to Wallace. It is unknown where they were disposed. Please refer to Sara Perry's supplemental report for details.

My body-worn camera was activated through the duration of the transportation. Please refer to my body worn camera footage for further details.

I was originally directed to arranging road closures and establishing an inner and outer perimeter of the scene. Caution tape was secured in a very broad area, along the roadways of French Avenue and Jenkins Street.

I was later tasked with transporting Officer Hooper from the crime scene back to the GVPD for his interview and evidence processing. At approx 1747 hours, I drove Officer Hooper to the GVPD. It should be known that Officer Hooper and I did not converse about the incident in anyway during the transport. On our arrival at the GVPD, I turned Officer Hooper over to Officer Johnson who was waiting for him at the police department.

At approx 1825 hours, I responded to the SNMH ER to make contact with Corporal Newman to collect his car keys. I observed VI inside the treatment room at this time. My body worn camera was activated in the case that VI said anything relevant, however I do not believe anything of evidentiary value was recorded.

I cleared the ER and returned to the scene to maintain scene security. I assisted in scene security within the outer perimeter of the location, later moving to scene security at the inner crime scene location of the second shooting. I was later relieved of the inner perimeter scene security by Officer Blake. At that time, my involvement in this incident ended.

SUMMARY:

On the above listed date and time I responded to [REDACTED] Jenkins Street to speak with [REDACTED] who had witnessed a portion of the events leading up to and following the incident at 418 French Avenue.

In summary, [REDACTED] advised me that he was standing in front of his apartment when the officer and the "complainant" were parked at the end of the driveway. [REDACTED] initially thought that they were going to the apartments across the street until her recognized that the subject with the officer used to live at 418 French Avenue. [REDACTED] told me that Austin had recently moved back to the residence about two months ago. [REDACTED] told me that the officer and the subject with him walked over to the garage and he

heard them call Austin's name "a couple times". [REDACTED] saw the officer walking back down the driveway to his patrol vehicle without the other subject. [REDACTED] then heard "some sort of vocalization" similar to "no" followed by two or three gunshots. [REDACTED] stated that he didn't think the officer heard the gunshots, so he said "dude, gunshots" to the officer at which point the officer turned around and said "really" before getting back into his vehicle and driving towards French Avenue. [REDACTED] stated that "you guys were here immediately" that there were 4 or 5 cruisers on scene. [REDACTED] said that within 4 or 5 minutes, he heard two more shots in the area of French Avenue and then heard "what was obviously a shotgun and that was the end of it".

I asked [REDACTED] if he could tell who made the vocalizations and he told me he could not.

[REDACTED] further advised that a group of officers on scene were already moving down Jenkins Street when he heard the two additional gunshots. He also stated that it was probably less than 10 minutes from the time when he saw the officer and subject walk towards the garage until he heard the shotgun blast coming from the area of French Avenue.

I was able to obtain a CHP dashboard camera from the CHP patrol vehicle that arrived on scene during the shooting.

The video shows a CHP patrol vehicle driving to the call for service for assistance regarding the shots fired call. The CHP Officer appears to turn onto French Avenue from Mill Street in Grass Valley CA.

As the vehicle approaches Jenkins Street, the CHP Officer is seen talking to a subject on the corner of French Avenue and Jenkins Street. (It should be noted that this subject was interviewed under a supplemental report).

The vehicle comes to a stop at the above intersection and stops his vehicle south of 410 French Avenue.

The CHP Officer is heard talking to a female subject who is believed to be Officer Sara Perry. They appear to be setting up a perimeter and containment area.

At around the 16:51:03 mark in the video, a subject appears in the yard of 410 French Avenue and is standing behind a fence that is approximately four feet tall. The subject appears to point towards the officers and a pop is heard. This appears to be a gunshot and it appears that he is firing at the perimeter officers. The subject quickly then runs out of view and the CHP Officer is heard contacting Dispatch and advising "Shots fired", "42-23 additional shots fired".

A female is heard saying, "behind the fence line". This is believed to be Officer Perry.

A few moments later, Officers are seen approaching the fence line.

At the 16:52:03 mark in the video, a subject is seen running across French Avenue from the front yard of 410 French Avenue. Officers then chase the subject on foot towards what appears to be 417 French Avenue.

NARRATIVE

I received the cell phone extraction data from Nevada County DA Investigator Tassone regarding (VI) [REDACTED] blue iPhone.

This was searched under search warrant # WA0000223 which was approved by Nevada County Judge Linda Sloven.

The cell phone was searched due to [REDACTED] advising that he had video recorded the incident when he attempted to contact (AR) Austin Wallace. He advised that there may have been actual video footage of the shooting.

I reviewed a video from [REDACTED] cell phone and below is a synopsis of that video:

The video shows from what [REDACTED] described as him walking down the side of 418 French Avenue. (It should be noted that this appears to be the side of the residence from my own recollection).

[REDACTED] advised that he went to climb the approximate 6' tall fence and put his cell phone into his jacket pocket. (It should be noted that at this point in the video the camera lens appears to be blocked but it still captures audio).

At around the 0:00:12 second mark in the video there is muffled talking for less than a second. A male subject (Believed to be [REDACTED]) is then heard saying, "Ow fuck!" "What the fuck" . "What the fuck" . "You fucking serious dude you going to shoot me?" .

The visual video footage appears again and points at the front porch of what appears to be 418 French Avenue and shows a male subject standing on the stairs. That subject is believed to be Austin Wallace.

Wallace then says something along the lines, "Ready to fucking die" .

[REDACTED] is then heard saying, "What the fuck did I do?" "You fucking robbed me" .

Around that time and officers patrol vehicle lights are seen driving towards him in the video.

██████ then says, " Where the fuck you going Austin back out the back" " He' s going out the back" .

It appears the officer is then heard saying, " You hurt?" this is believed to be Officer Hooper.

██████ then says, " He' s going out the back" . " No it was a rubber bullet or something" .

There is a second video where ██████ is walking around after that incident. He shows the bullet wound on his stomach during that video and stays at that location until Officer Newman arrives on scene.
